

General Information for those attending the PAN Intercomparison Experiment (PIE)

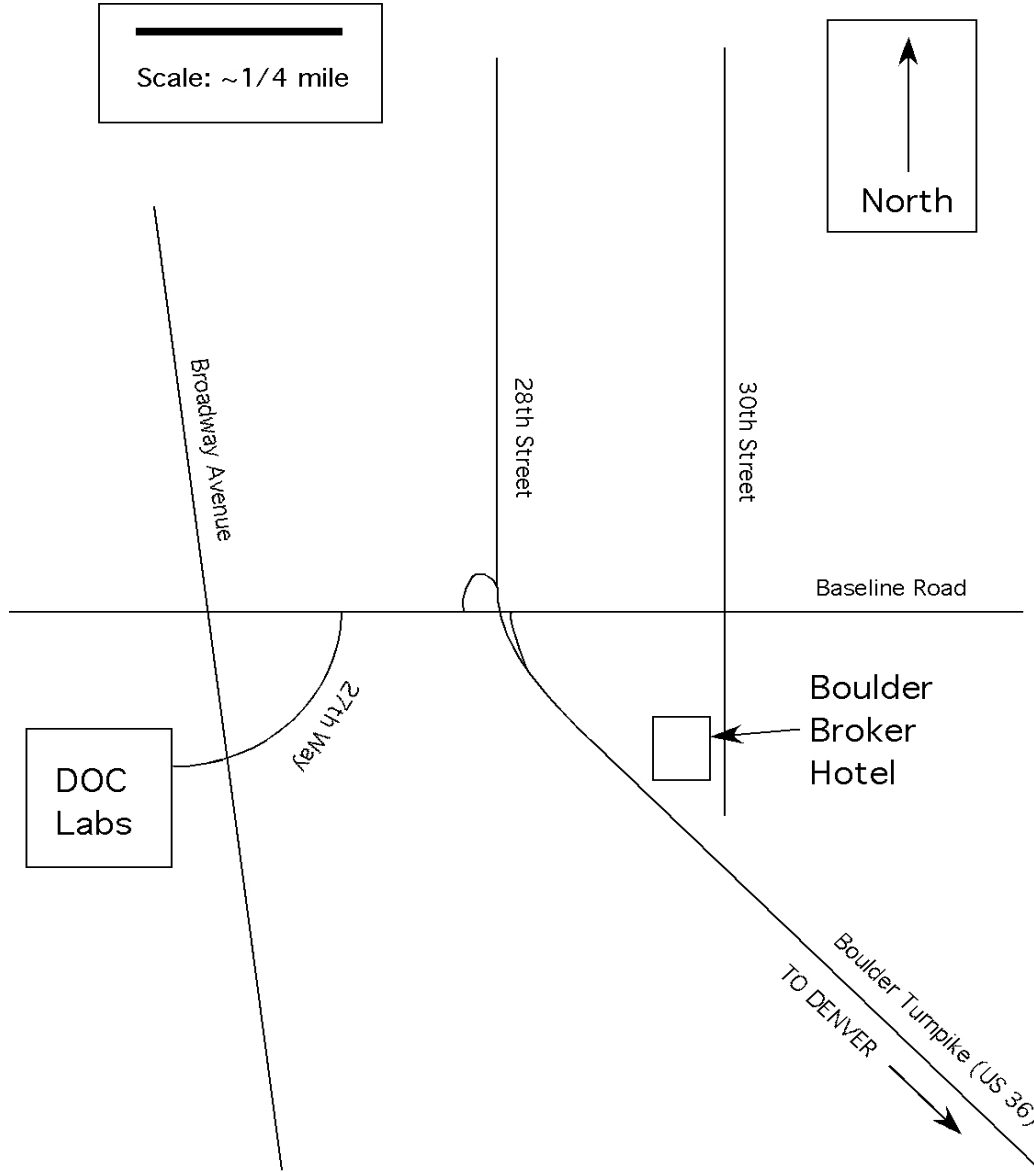

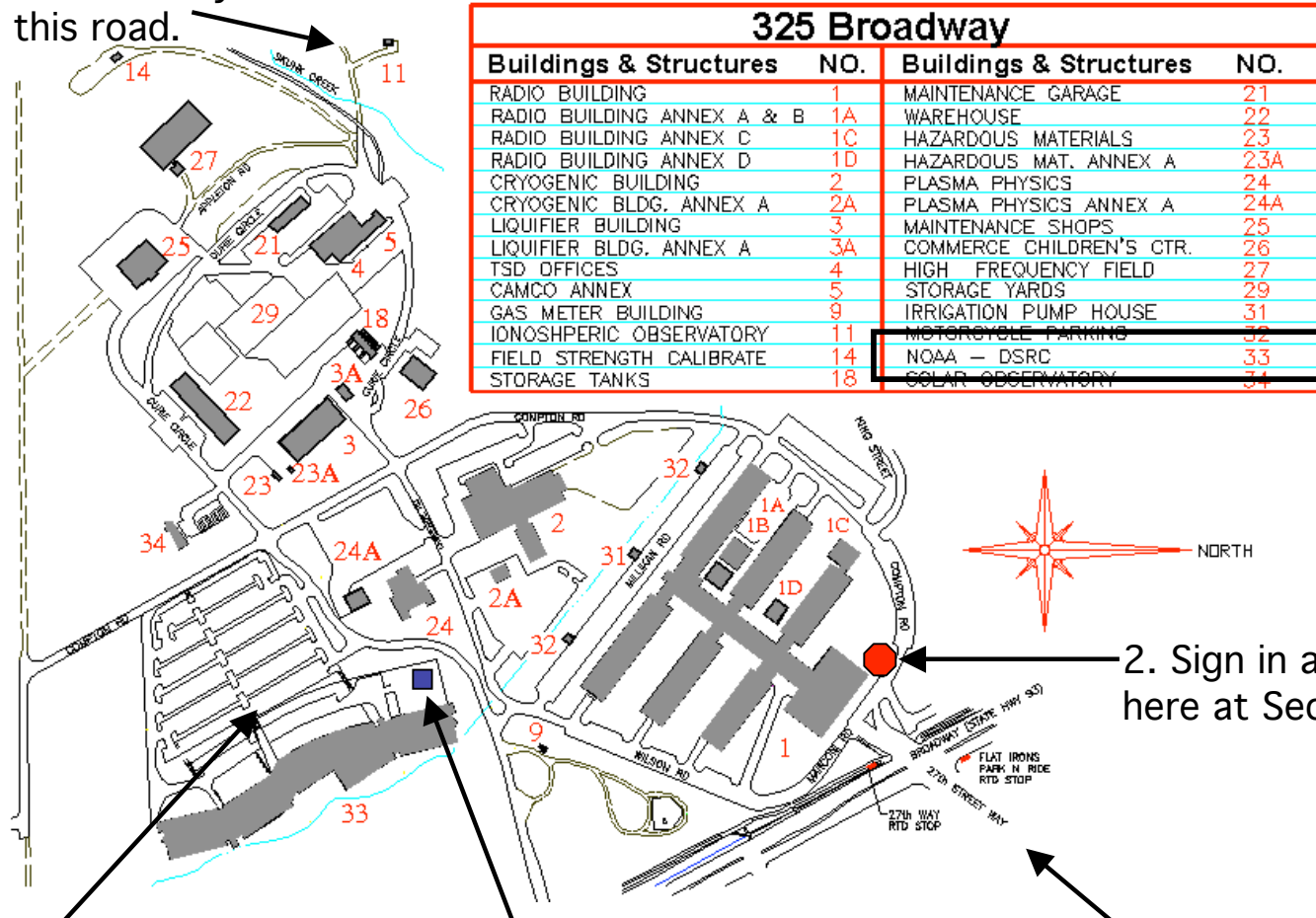


To drive from the airport you will first be on Pena Blvd going toward Denver. Take the E470 exit, going west/north to Boulder/Ft. Collins. This is a toll road, so you will need 3 X \$1.75 = \$5.25. After 30 miles or so the expressway (which has changed to the Northwest Parkway) ends, the next MAJOR intersection will be US 36, otherwise known as the Boulder Turnpike. Go right (west) toward Boulder. The first Boulder exit is Foothills Parkway and the next is Baseline Road. Take that exit. If you're going to the hotel (Broker), then go right. If you're coming to the Lab, then go left. See the map at right for details. The total drive time from DIA to Boulder is on the order of 1 hour (assuming you have no adventures on the way).

There is a shuttle from Denver International Airport (DIA) to Boulder. Their web site is at: <http://www.yellowtrans.com> and has all the information you'll need.
